



Accreditation to Teach in a Catholic School & To Teach Religious Education Policy

Approved by the EREA Board 27 August 2013

Rationale:	There is a need for all teachers in EREA schools to have accreditation to teach in a Catholic School and for all teachers of Religious Education in EREA schools to have the appropriate accreditation to teach Religious Education from the Diocese in which the school is located.
Principles:	EREA operates within the context of the Charter which is underpinned by EREA core values. EREA is committed to relationship with church, professionalism and formation.
Policy Statement:	All teachers in EREA schools will be accredited and all teachers of Religious Education in EREA schools will be accredited in accord with the local Diocesan requirements.
Applicable to:	All teachers in EREA schools.
Key Responsibilities:	The Executive Director has responsibility for the implementation of this policy and to ensure delegations are in place.
Effective From:	August 2013
Review:	Consideration will be given every 2 years to determine if this policy requires review earlier than 2017.
