Formation for a Listening Heart

Formation for mission in Catholic Education is "formation of the heart".¹ Both scriptural tradition and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander spirituality remind us that a listening heart is key to opening ourselves to the presence of the Sacred in our lives. Miriam Rose Ungunmerr Baumann^{ix} offers us an insight:

There are deep springs within each of us. Within this deep spring, which is the very Spirit of God, is a sound. The sound of Deep calling to Deep. The sound is the word of God – Jesus.ⁱⁱⁱ


The MYSTERY of the Divine we name GOD

Formation helps us to understand, value and express our identity and activity as Catholic Schools in the Edmund Rice Tradition. At the heart of this tradition is the Mystery of the Divine we name God, revealed in Jesus and continuing to breathe life into all creation through the movement of the Holy Spirit. EREA Formation invites us to immerse ourselves in this unfolding self-communication of God's loving vision of a better world for all, made visible through:



The visualisation of the EREA Formation design has two components:

- 1. The **Spiral**, representing the Mystery of the Divine we name God.
- 2. The Sails, representing the Charism of Edmund Rice expressed in the Charter Touchstones.



In its entirety, the **Spiral** embodies the Mystery of the Divine we name God, eternally present in the unfolding of creation. The EREA story, which is part of this revelation, derives meaning from all life-giving stories, but most notably First Nations Wisdoms, the Life of Jesus, and Edmund's response to the Gospel. Our participation as EREA communities invites us to bring contemporary form to this ever-expanding expression of God's loving vision of a better world for all.

The rotation of the sails of a windmill creates energy. In a similar way, the Touchstones - the Sails in the visualisation - draw energy from our stories and transform this into living expressions of the Charism of Edmund Rice. The dynamic relationship between our foundational stories and the Touchstones is reflected in the way that each one energises the other. This energy liberates us to participate in the ongoing realisation of God's vision of a better world for all.

EREA's Foundational Stories

EREA Formation opens us to God's presence in First Nations Wisdoms, the life of Jesus, Edmund's response to the Gospel; and Our participation as EREA communities.

First Nations Wisdoms reveal God's presence through:

- spiritual connectedness to all living systems, made most explicit in Caring for Country;
- the stories, ways of Knowing and experiences of the world's oldest continuous living cultures;
- deep respectful listening; and
- truth-telling, reconciliation and healing.

The Life of Jesus reveals God's presence through his:

- unbounded love, compassionate presence and liberation for justice and peace;
- attention to, and radical challenge of, unjust structures diminishing people's humanity;
- role as a liberating teacher (Rabbi); and
- healing that restores life giving relationships.

Edmund's response to the Gospel reveals God's presence through his:

- capacity to see God in all things;
- his willingness to challenge attitudes and structures not in alignment with Jesus' teaching;
- pursuit of a mutually liberating education; and
- reflective action as part of a faith community.

Our participation as EREA communities

reveals God's presence through our:

- education of the whole person, formed in the image of God;
- liberating practices that enable deep listening, confidence, agency and freedom;
- integration of the Gospel and Edmund's charism with our lived realities; and
- communication of possibility and hope.

The EREA Charter Touchstones

EREA Formation opens us to participation in the Reign of God^v in building a better world for all, through a Liberating Education, based on a Gospel Spirituality, within an Inclusive Community committed to Justice and Solidarity.

- critique of the structural causes of injustice using Catholic social teaching;
- deep listening to and preferential love for those most in need;
- collaboration with charism partners in being agents of change.

Informed by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Wisdoms, Spiritualities and Knowings, and shaped by the movement of the Holy Spirit and humanity's evolving understanding of its place within the greater web of life on Earth, this Formation Design honours the unique stories and celebrates the diversity of all individuals, groups and beings within and beyond Edmund Rice Education Australia.

Formation, within our Christian tradition, invites us into a space where we can discern the presence of God's Spirit in our midst, inspiring courage, creativity and hope in our response. (Acts 2:1-13).

Formation is a canonical responsibility and mandated priority of EREA. Its accountability is identified in school and system strategic plans, budgets and EREA Renewal cycles.

The Formation Design draws significantly upon <u>"The</u> <u>Good Seed Will Grow" - A Formation Framework for</u> <u>Edmund Rice Communities in Oceania (2014)</u>, but is also informed by evolving EREA understandings and strategic priorities.

The Formation Design is informed by all principles underpinning the EREA Formation, Professional Learning and Leadership Development Framework (pending finalisation), promoting relationships based on respect, trust, inclusion, and integrity. It honours the diversity of the spiritual journey by providing multiple entry points that invite participants to discern the unique vocational contribution that they make to the life of their community. "Discernment is not a form of egotistical introspection, but an authentic process of leaving ourselves behind in order to approach the mystery of God, who helps us to carry out the mission to which we are called." - Pope Francis - The Call to Holiness in our World 5:175

Since there is a formative dimension to every aspect of Catholic schooling, intentional formation provides an orientation for the whole life of an educational community. This Formation Design exists to support those responsible for the creation, evaluation and review of formative experiences designed for individuals, groups or entire school or office-based communities within EREA.

EREA Formation acts to explore, interpret and bring to life an Edmund Rice charism that "offers a contemporary compelling story, which has woven in its fabric a language with which to touch hearts, a passion to right wrongs, a mind to combat ignorance, ... a mission to embrace and most importantly a face in which Christ is recognised." - The Price of Freedom, Denis McLaughlin

Formation within the Catholic tradition recognises that the human person finds God in and through others and that co-creative partnership with God is realised through our work for justice for all in the human community and our "care for our common home".
